In the past few years, I have demonstrated the ability to lead and inspire change as well as grow teams locally and internationally.

As a Vice-Chancellor at Clarke International University (CIU), I have successfully completed the rebranding of the university; Led the building of a new purpose-built campus; fostered turnaround in student growth and diversification of programs; secured new strategic partnerships; fostered continuity of learning and teaching during Covid-19 through securing Emergency Open Distance and eLearning approval from higher education councils; and Drove 10% increase in operating income for the university (Surpassed budget targets for 3 consecutive years including the Covid-19 period)

As an education leader, I am actively involved in change management, curriculum development/redesign, research/learning/teaching/community outreach, and strategic and operational management. I am currently the Institutional Coordinator and Faculty Mentor for the Makerere, CIU, Busitema, and Kabaale Universities' NIH HEPI grant: a 5-year grant to strengthen health systems through fostering better health professional education.

I am a Distinguished Alumnae at Yale University (2018) and a Hall of Distinction Alumnae at Arkansas Tech University (2020).
